Required documents¹

1. A printed, filled in and signed electronic application form including a photograph submitted in the electronic form.
2. A higher education diploma at the Bachelor`s level or higher, or its official copy or a photocopy certified by a notary public². A diploma obtained abroad should be legalized or endorsed with an apostille, or acknowledged as equivalent to a Polish diploma in accordance with nostrification regulations or international agreements³.
3. The original, its official copy or a photocopy certified by a notary public, of a Polish secondary school-leaving examination certificate obtained under either the new or the old secondary school-leaving examination system, an IB (International Baccalaureate) diploma issued by the International Baccalaureate Organisation in Geneva, an EB (European Baccalaureate) diploma issued by the European Schools pursuant to the Luxembourg Convention defining the Statute of the European Schools of 21st June 1994 or a secondary school-leaving examination certificate obtained abroad.
4. A document confirming the knowledge of English.
5. A certified photocopy of an ID.
6. Two student card type photographs.
7. A doctor`s certificate of no contraindications to study.
8. Receipt of payment of a non-returnable enrolment fee to the bank account of the Warsaw School of Economics⁴.

¹ For the full text of the enrolment requirements please check Rules of Enrolment at the Warsaw School of Economics in the academic year 2010/2011, which is the Appendix to Resolution No. 133 of the Senate of the WSE of 27th May of 2009 including the typing mistakes corrections made by Resolution No. 251 of the Senate of the WSE of 16th December 2009 which is the only legally binding text.

² Applicants who have not received their diploma yet shall participate in the admission process based on a individual decision given, after applying, by the Rector of the Warsaw School of Economics.

³ According to Polish regulations any foreign diploma needs to be officially recognized in Poland by the process of nostrification. The candidate may apply to the Rector of the Warsaw School of Economics for exemption of his/her diploma from nostrification in order to undertake second-degree studies at the Warsaw School of Economics.

⁴ The documents shall be submitted personally or through a proxy. The documents may also be sent by post provided that they reach the Warsaw School of Economics by the end of the last day for submitting documents specified in the enrolment schedule.
